


ACC Transfer Intent Student Survey 2020

- Online survey administered Spring 2020 to ACC students enrolled in gateway courses
 - Survey open April 30th May 10th
- Response rate 12.2%
 - 2,138 responses out of 17,375 students surveyed

Large percentages of students are interested in transfer. The majority aim to complete an associate degree, as well.

- 94% of students planning to transfer indicated they were likely or very likely to do so.
- 54% of students plan to earn an associate degree prior to transfer.






- Plan to earn an associate degree

Students identify costs and debt, admissions, and schedule conflicts as the biggest barriers to transfer.

What might prevent you from attending a four-year college or university?



Students would like more help to navigate the transfer process.

- Regarding what students might need help with,
 - 79% agreed or strongly agreed they need help learning about program specific admissions policies and 75% agreed or strongly agreed they need help learning about general admissions policies at 4-year institutions
 - 74% agreed or strongly agreed they need help with completing their application
 - 71% agreed or strongly agreed they need help to meet with an ACC transfer specialist

COVID-19 is changing students' plans for transfer.

- 43% of respondents indicated that the COVID-19 pandemic impacted their transfer plans.
- Affected students plan to spend more time at ACC, to take fewer courses, or to delay transfer.
